

## It's In Our Hands... This March, Please Participate in 2010 Census

The once every 10 years Census is approaching. You will receive a questionnaire during March 15-17, 2010 in your mail box (you may receive an advanced letter by March 8-10, 2010 in the mail). As most of you already know, a Census is a count of everyone residing in the United States. All U.S. residents must be counted. This includes people of all ages, races, ethnic groups, both citizens and non-citizens.

#### It's Important:

The first census took place in 1790 to determine the number of seats each state would have in the U.S. House of Representatives. The upcoming Census is the 23<sup>rd</sup> Census in the US history. State and local legislative and congressional districts boundaries are also determined by Census data.

Every year, the federal government allocates more than \$400 billion to states and local communities based, in part, on Census data. The data is also used to determine locations for retail stores, schools, hospitals, new housing developments and other community facilities.

According to Brookings research, in 2008, every Californian got \$1,700 from Federal government; that means \$17,000 for 10 years per person. You may understand better now how important it is for everyone to participate in the Census and why we emphasize that "everyone be counted."

# Free Income Tax Preparation by Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program, sponsored by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), is available for qualifying families and individuals at the Fremont Family Resource Center. (510) 574-2020

If your family income is less than \$52,000 annually, VITA volunteers can help you file your tax returns for free!!! You may also be eligible for the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and/or other credits you did not know about, which can result in MORE MONEY in your pocket!!! For example, a married couple filing jointly with 3 qualifying children, who have social security numbers, may qualify up to \$5,657 of MORE Federal Income Tax Refunds \$\$\$

#### What to Bring:

- Picture ID and <u>original</u> Social Security Cards for all family members (Sorry, no exceptions)
- All forms, W-2 AND 1099'S for all 2009 jobs & income
- Information for all other income (interest, savings, IRA's, etc)
- Information for all deductions and credits
  - Childcare provider information (SSN or EIN & address)
  - Name address & phone number of landlord, if applicable
- A copy of last year's tax return is helpful
- Married couples filing jointly must come together
- For Direct Deposit of tax refund, please bring routing & account numbers for savings and/or checking accounts for split refund service (and a faster refund!)

#### 2010 Census....con't

#### It's Easy:

The 2010 Census questionnaire is one of the shortest questionnaires in history. There are only 10 questions on the form and it takes approximately 10 minutes to complete. Households are asked to provide key demographic information, including: whether a housing unit is rented or owned; and the names, genders, ages and races of others living in the household.

Participating in the Census is required by law. Households should complete and mail back their questionnaires upon receipt. Households that do not respond may receive a replacement questionnaire in early April. Census takers will visit households that do not return questionnaires to take a count in person.

#### It's Safe:

By law, the Census Bureau cannot share individual's responses with anyone, including other federal agencies and law enforcement entities.

CBC is one of the Census partners that committed to help promoting the Census. The very first Census 101 flyer distributed in Northern California in Chinese was (part) translated by CBC; CBC's internship program supported the Census Young Ambassador project; CBC provided speaking opportunities to Census staff in promoting Census, distributing Census literature, etc., and giving me space to spread the Census message via this newsletter.

Please accept my sincere appreciation to the CBC Board and leaders for their commitments and contributions. Let's work together, making sure all members of CBC, your relatives, friends and coworkers are all counted by Census Day: April 1, 2010. Remember, an accurate and complete census 2010 is in our hands!

# A Contemplation of Clouds

Mr. Toastmaster, fellow Toastmasters and honored guests... One of my favorite things to do is watch the clouds in the sky. Now, I'm not talking about when you were a kid and imagined those clouds to be shapes of other things. My hobby is more like sleeping. Some people enjoy sleeping and napping. To others, it's just something to do to stay alive and sane. I love clouds because they play a vital role in sustaining life on our planet, because of their ever changing beauty, and because they stir our inner passions and spirituality.

What are clouds but frozen droplets of water in the atmosphere? When they are closer to the ground or near a body of water, they are fog and mist. Yet they protect the earth's surface from the harsh solar rays. You all know that dark surfaces absorb more light. Without white clouds to reflect the sunlight, the ground and bodies of water would absorb all the light and our planet would fry to death. In addition, clouds are responsible for carrying water vapor from one place to another. The tropical rain forests near the equator are some of the wettest places on earth. The evaporated water from those forests is carried into the atmosphere and form clouds when it becomes cold. Finally, when the clouds become too heavy, they dump all the collected water in the form of precipitation, such as rain and snow. It's a glorious process. On some days, when I'm watching the winds blow patches of clouds across the sky, I imagine the clouds' journey. Where did they form, and what foreign, exotic lands have they passed over? I watch their massive shadows pass over me, as if they were gigantic airborne whales. If they had eyes, what did they see, so high up? Where will they meet their end, when they finally disperse? It's an intriguing mystery.

Like a shifting watercolor painting, clouds constantly change shape and color. No two clouds are ever the same. There are many kinds of clouds – gray and dark clouds on an overcast day, white and puffy clouds during the summertime, or blazing clouds exploding with pink and purple hues during sunset. The beauty of clouds is indescribable and breath taking, but I will make an attempt to describe some of my favorite scenery. ----- Winter has passed, and I look back with nostalgia at the memory of the emerald Mission hills on a rainy day. The somber sky, dark and gray, brings out the crisp and fresh green color. When the streaks of mist sweep over the rolling hills, they seem like gentle fingers slowly caressing the lovely slopes. On summer days like now, puffy soft clouds resembling cotton balls are common. I love to sit

by my window and gaze at the endless parade of white fluffs flowing across my field of vision and then fall to pieces. However, my ultimate favorite sights are sunsets. It is simply unforgettable to watch the sun as it sinks to the horizon, at which point the clouds in the sky catch fire and burn with crimson and scarlet plumes that tower over the landscape. Within several short minutes, as the dusk and twilight approach, the fiery sky fades to violet and periwinkle, and leaves a soft rosy blue overhead, glistening with the last light of the day.

The beauty of clouds is a feast for the eyes, but it also feeds the soul. Views of the world's natural splendor are a gateway to inner happiness. To look upon nature as it is meant to be is to catch a glimpse into your own being. Sometimes at night, I stand in my yard and raise my eyes to the heavens to glance at the bright moonlight piercing through the cloud cover. Occasionally there is a ring around the full moon, with subtle nuances of rainbow colors. Science explains that this is an atmospheric phenomenon, but I only see a divine marvel. Gazing at the ethereal spectacle, all small vexations vanish and the beauty of things stands out, the shadowy silhouette of the still palm trees, the playful twinkle of the distant stars, the smell of the calm air. For a moment, my heart beats in sync with the cosmic pulse. In that instant, I don't exist; my essence is mixed with the elements. Then I become aware of myself again, and go back to my daily routine, but knowing that at any minute, all I have to do is look to the sky to recapture that magical moment.

And there you have it; three marvelous things about clouds. I live near Ohlone College. There is a small wooded area near the slopes, where clumps of golden daffodils line the path. As I walk and watch the clouds overhead, I feel the spirit of Mr. William Wordsworth standing next to me. Whether you're a self-labeled Romantic or not, sometimes, just drop what you're doing and look up at the amazing splendor above you. You will feel comforted, you will feel closer to Nature, you will feel your vexations melt away, even for a brief moment, and I hope you feel what I shared with you today.
