Message from CBC's Vice President

I have joined CBC since 2004, but did not get actively involved, partly because I was busy with many other things including my commitment to the Fremont



School Board, and partly because I had a different opinion as to how CBC should carry out its mission. CBC's mission statement is clear "To initiate, sponsor and promote community events, which will affect the well being of Chinese Americans with an emphasis on education, health, business and community involvement." Yet, the perception that CBC is a "political" organization, in my opinion, hinders CBC's effectiveness to reach out to the very population that it seeks to serve.

In order to truly affect the well being of Chinese Americans, CBC needs to connect with them in a more meaningful and substantive way. This means more than just making donations, or attending special events. It is to really get to know people's needs and provide resources, information and support to meet those needs. CBC is already doing many of these things and is doing

them quite well – Internship and Toastmaster Programs; supporting local charitable organizations; educating Chinese American community on civic responsibilities and physical & mental health issues; sharing Chinese culture, language, art and customs with the greater community; promoting justice and overall fair representation. However, there are more that can be done, especially in this economic down time.

As the new vice president, I look forward to working with CBC Board, President, staff and volunteers to get in-depth understanding of the needs of our community. There are some charitable and non-profit organizations that we are not too familiar with, but they are doing a lot of good for our community – Tri-City Young Life, Tri-City Volunteers, CAPA (Child Abuse Prevention Agency), Seneca Center, to name a few. We should try to work with them. By working more collaboratively with other agencies including schools, health facilities, business associations, church organizations and volunteer groups, we will be able to better serve our community.

Success! In Fremont's Chinese Immersion Program

Greetings! I am excited to share with you news of the continued success of the Azevada Elementary School Chinese (Mandarin) Immersion Program ("Program"), a magnet program started by Fremont Unified School District (FUSD) in the Fall of 2010. With this year's pilot kindergarten class full and prospective parents eagerly calling to sign up their children, FUSD is planning to expand the Program to two kindergarten and two first grade classes starting the Fall of 2011. The first kindergarten and 1st grade classes are full. Registration is ongoing for the 2nd kindergarten and 1st grade classes. Space is limited.

What is Chinese Language Immersion?

The language immersion approach is a proven. effective method of providing children with a wellrounded, academically excellent education and full mastery of both English and any target language. Several Bay Area public and private schools, including schools in Palo Alto, Cupertino, Los Altos and San Francisco, have reported phenomenal academic success in Chinese Immersion programs and more and more are being established across the nation. Studies have shown that besides the social and economic advantages of bilingualism, immersion learners exhibit greater nonverbal problem-solving abilities and more flexible thinking. In addition, immersion students score as well as or better than non-immersion peers on standardized measures of verbal and mathematics skills administered in English .1

Fremont's Chinese Immersion Program:

Instruction Model: Instruction starts with the 90/10 model, which is 90% in Mandarin and 10% in English for Kindergarten and 1st grade. Beyond those grades, Mandarin instruction will decrease 10% and English increase 10% each year until they are evenly split. Instruction follows standard state-mandated guidelines. The only difference between Englishtaught and Chinese immersion classes is the language of instruction.

Curriculum: Curriculum is based on the *Better Chinese* textbook series, which is used in San Francisco and the Fremont Chinese School.

School Site: Azevada Elementary School (39450 Royal Palm Drive, near Mowry and Interstate 880)

After-school Daycare: Quality private on-site and other local daycare is available with Mandarin language support.

2010-2011 SBCC Scholarship Application Going Electronic

The Scholarship Committee is doing our part to save trees by getting rid of the paper applications. Students can now fill out an electronic version of the application form using the latest version of Adobe Reader that can be downloaded for free from Adobe.com. The form also includes space for the students to type in their essay which used to require the student to use their own word processing applications. This e-application form can be requested by sending an email to sbcc.scholarship@gmail.com with "2010-2011 Scholarship Application Request" on the subject line and including the following information in the body of the email:

- 1) The student's full name
- 2) Name of High School currently attending
- 3) The email address to receive the application forms

Once the request email is received, the student can expect to receive the application file and the instructions within a couple of days. The student will still need to send in their official transcript and a letter of recommendation in the mail. All documents, including the e-application must be received by the *March 12th*, 2011 deadline.

We believe that this new e-process will be more efficient than the previous paper and snail mail process while also making it an easier job for the students to fill out the applications and our readers to evaluate the applications. The ultimate goal is to put the application online similar to what most colleges and universities are doing today with their admission applications. This effort will require more significant effort and we do not have the same resources as these universities. We will evaluate its feasibility for implementing in the near future.

While the process is new to all – including our Scholarship Committee members, the students seem to be adapting very well. We have received several email requests for the e-application starting on Christmas Eve. Nevertheless, we still need our SBCC members to help pass the words of this new scholarship application process to your friends and family members who have eligible student applicants.

"Day of Inclusion"

The "Day of Inclusion" was authored by Assemblyman Mike Eng and designated in 2009 as such by means of California State Assembly Concurrent Resolution (ACR) 76 to be December 17th.

On December 17, 1943, the Magnuson Act repealed the Chinese Exclusion Act of 1882 and marked a turning point regarding society's harsh attitudes towards immigration and immigrants. By repealing the "Chinese Exclusion" prohibitions, the United States expressed its commitment to continue to break down cultural barriers, appreciate differences, enrich cultural diversity, and further racial, religious and cultural tolerance. The hope and aspiration of America's future lies in embracing our shared differences.

December 17th, the Day of Inclusion, is a day set aside for all of us to remember and learn about the sacrifices and contributions of those in our immigrant heritage. We become a more perfect Union by embracing our shared differences and common goals in becoming American.



Free Income Tax Preparation by Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program



For the 9th year, the City of Fremont's Family Resource Center will be providing FREE tax preparation for qualified individuals and families with household income of less than \$49,000 annually. Tax returns are prepared by IRS-certified VITA volunteer tax preparers.

You may also be eligible for the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and other credits, which can result in MORE MONEY in your pocket!!! For example, a married couple filing jointly with 3 qualifying children, who have social security numbers, may qualify up to \$5.657 of MORE Federal Income Tax Refunds \$\$\$.

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program, sponsored by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), and the United Way of the Bay Area Earn It! Keep It! Save It! Coalition, is available for qualifying families and individuals at the Fremont Family Resource Center.

 - Childcare provider information (SSN or EIN & address)

➤ For Direct Deposit of tax refund, please bring routing & account numbers for savings and/or checking accounts for split refund service (and a faster refund!)

Will not prepare:

- Married filing separately
- > Form 2106 (employee business expenses)
- > Form 8615 (minor's investment income)
- ➤ Schedule C with losses over \$10,000 and depreciation
- Schedule E (rental income and loss)
- > Form 8606 (non-deductible IRA)
- > 1040NR (non-resident)
- > Self employment with over \$10,000 in expenses
