Dear CBC members, friends and supporters,

I hope everyone is enjoying the rest of summer!

Congratulations to the students who have completed CBC's youth summer internship work session! We are in the process of planning the Internship Recognition Luncheon where the interns will give speeches and be awarded their certificates and stipend checks. Essays describing their experience this summer must be submitted to fulfill the program's requirements. We had a record number of interns this year so I would like to gently remind the students to start submitting their essays to our program coordinators as soon as possible.

Also, as many of you already know, CBC is working with the U.S. Census which must be completed by April 1, 2010. The census is a count of everyone living in the United States every 10 years and is mandated by the U.S. Constitution. Census data are used to distribute Congressional seats to the 50 states, to make decisions on what community services to provide, and to distribute \$300 billion in federal funds to local, state and tribal governments every year. Everyone is required to participate as a matter of law but the survey will take just 10 minutes to complete and federal law protects the personal information you share during the census.

CBC encourages everyone to participate and to spread the word to their families, friends, and business associates. In fact, CBC will be featuring the U.S. Census at many of its upcoming functions providing you with the convenience of working with onsite volunteers! The census surveys are

CBC Wins First Place Award in Fremont's 4th of July Parade

The 2009 Fremont Fourth of July Parade was held in Warm Springs. CBC was proud to support the parade again and captured 1st place finish in the Novelty Category.

CBC, under the leadership of Amy Cho, coordinated several local Chinese American organizations and put together an entry for the parade. The organizations included: (1) Citizens for Better Community (CBC), (2) South Bay Chinese Club (SBCC), (3) Friends of Children with Special Needs (FCSN), (4) Northwestern Polytechnic University (NPU), (5) California Youth Chinese Symphony (CYCS), (6) Purple Lotus Buddhist School, (7) Purple Lotus Temple, (8) Boy Scouts of America, Troop 468.

All together there were about 225 participants. The CBC entry was the largest group in the parade and we stretched almost an entire city block. Our own CBC organization together with our sister organization, SBCC, led the group marching down Warm Springs Boulevard. It was guite an impressive display of Red/White/Blue! The FCSN served as an inspiration to all participants and to the viewers as well. Despite their limitations, they showed that anything is possible. The CYCS, riding on 2 flat bed trucks, was a crowd favorite because they played American patriotic music on Chinese musical instruments. What a blend of culture to see and hear. Another crowd favorite was the miniature dragons. The dragons, dancing to their drumbeats, were part of the Purple Lotus Buddhist School. Of course, Boy Scouts Troop 468 was also a crowd favorite

because of their colorful uniforms and their high profile among youth organizations.

This year, CBC had the honor to include a group of students from the Northwestern Polytechnic University. Almost all the students were from foreign countries and marching in parade was a first for them. They may not have a good understanding of what July 4th is but their enthusiasm for the parade came through loud and clear.

The parade was 1.2 miles long and the route was lined with people from start to finish. People that had never marched in a parade even wished the parade route had been longer. It was a time for friends to chat and celebrate America's birthday together.

At the end of the parade, CBC treated all participants in the CBC parade group to a delicious ice-cold cup of Baskin-Robbins Ice Cream. CBC had made prior arrangements with Michelle Koan and her husband (owners of Warm Springs Baskin-Robbins) to have the ice cream cups delivered "Just in Time" so our kids can have a treat.

CBC wishes to thank everyone for showing up and participating with us. Plan to come next year again! Next July will be here again before we know it.
