South Bay Chinese Service Club's 2007 Annual Scholarship Luncheon

This year the South Bay Chinese Service Club awarded \$10,000 in scholarships to graduating high school seniors of Chinese descent at our 38th annual SBCSC Scholarship Luncheon held at the Courtyard by Marriott, Newark-Silicon Valley on Saturday, April 1, 2007. SBCSC President Mary K. Lim greeted the graduates and praised them for their outstanding academic records and participation in community activities. Each applicant was introduced and presented with certificates of recognition from Congressman Pete Stark, State Senator Ellen Corbett, Assemblyman Albert Torrico and Alameda County Supervisor Scott Haggerty. Honored guests included Congressman Pete Stark, his son Fish, and assistant Jo Cazenave, Fremont Mayor Bob Wasserman, City Councilman Steve Cho and his wife, Amy, Planning Commissioner David Bonaccorsi, Fremont School Board Members Peggy Herndon, Nina Moore, Lara York and Ivy Wu, Citizens for Better Community Board Members Thomas Tang, Angela Yang and Lena Zee, and former Assemblymember John Dutra was represented by his wife Bernadine, and John J. Dutra of Dutra Enterprises.

Our speakers were Fremont School Board member Ivy Wu and Ohlone College Board Trustee and previous SBCSC scholarship winner Garrett Yee. Both speakers shared their experiences. They advised the students to pursue their dreams, challenge themselves, work hard and dare to step out of their comfort zones. They encouraged them to pursue their dreams, choose their experiences wisely and strive to keep their integrity. Both presentations were very well received by the students, their parents, club members, donors and local dignitaries.

The 18 applicants represented 4 different high schools in the Tri City area. They are an impressive group of scholars. Their average GPA is 3.80 and together they have donated over 5,380 community service hours. In this group there are 4 National Merit Finalists, 4 AP Scholars, 4 students with perfect unweighted 4.0 GPA's, and 1 valedictorian.

Volunteers Wanted to Participate in a Special Diabetes Research Study

Dr. Christine Kwan, Project Director from UCSF, is looking for volunteers who have Type 2 diabetes in the South County area to participate in a special diabetes research study. Because the rate of Type 2 diabetes is 2-3 higher in the Chinese population as compared to other ethnic groups, the study will help to establish norms and help to determine possible causes. The study will also serve to create a basis for future funding on a State and Federal level.

UCSF is recruiting participants for a research study about the roles of family and culture on diabetes management. If you have Type 2 diabetes, are a Chinese or Chinese American, are married or live with a partner, and aged 35-75, you may be eligible to participate in the study.
