Garrett Yee Promoted to Colonel

Fremont, CA - Garrett Yee announced that he has been selected for promotion to Colonel in the U.S. Army Reserve, as noted in the Congressional Record dated February 23, 2009. Garrett has been twice activated for full-time duty, for a total of 26 months, including a deployment to Iraq in support of Operation Iraqi Freedom from July to December 2006.

He has since written a book about his experiences in Iraq titled "Greetings from Iraq," which is available

through online book sellers such as Barnes and Noble and Amazon. In his current assignment, Garrett is a Group Commander in charge of approximately 1,300 soldiers stationed throughout the southwestern states and Hawaii.

In addition to being active in Citizens for Better Community, Garrett remains active in community affairs in the Tri-Cities area, including Ohlone College Board Trustee and in Boy Scout leadership.

South Bay Chinese Service Club's 2008-2009 Scholarship Program

The Scholarship Committee is getting ready for the Scholarship Awards and Luncheon on *Saturday, April 25, 2009* at 12 pm at the Courtyard by Marriott in Newark. We have two wonderful speakers lined up for the Luncheon who will be able to will share their experiences and give some great advice to the high school seniors and their guests.

The South Bay Chinese Service Club is honored this year to have Leland Yee, California State Senator, speak to our graduating seniors. Leland was elected to the State Senate in November 2006, after serving four years in the California State Assembly



representing District 8, which includes San Francisco and San Mateo County. Yee is the first Chinese American ever elected to the California State Senate and the first Asian American elected to the Legislature's upper house in forty years. Yee is also a member of the Senate Democratic Leadership as the Assistant President pro Tem.

During his tenure in the Legislature, Senator Yee has fought for children, mental health services, working families, open government, consumer protection, the environment, and civil rights. He has been named "Legislator of the Year" by the California Association of School Psychologists: California School Nutrition Association; California Psychiatric Association; Faculty Association of California Community Colleges: California Independent Grocers: California Mental Health Directors Association: California Staffing Professionals; Associated Students of UC Davis; California Partnership to End Domestic Violence: and the American Federation of State, County and Municipal Employees. In addition, he was named "Person of the Year" by GamePolitics.com, a leading video game news site.

Prior to serving in the Legislature, Dr. Yee spent eight years on the San Francisco Unified School District Board of Education where he fought to streamline bureaucracy, direct funds towards higher standards in core curriculum, update educational materials, reduce class sizes, and increase public access to school services. In 1996, Dr. Yee was elected to the San Francisco Board of Supervisors. As Chair of the Finance Committee, he championed fiscal responsibility and accountability and established the largest "Rainy Day" budget reserve in San Francisco's history. Yee introduced and passed the General Obligation Bond Accountability Act and authored the Sunshine Ordinance to allow the public real access to what goes on at City Hall. He also became the first Supervisor to hold budget hearings in San Francisco neighborhoods, making it easier for communities to participate in the local budget process.

Leland Yee emigrated at the age of three to San Francisco from China. He was educated in San Francisco's public schools, and received his bachelor's degree from University of California at Berkeley, and his master's degree from San Francisco State University. After earning his doctorate in Child Psychology at the University of Hawaii, Dr. Yee worked in various mental health and school settings. Leland Yee and his wife have four children.

Sandy Liao is a former recipient of the SBCSC Scholarship in 2003. She graduated from San Leandro High School and attended UC Berkeley graduating with honors in 2007 with a degree in Molecular Environmental Biology. She is currently a



Research Associate with Merck & Co, in San Francisco. She has worked as a Biochemist for Siemens Healthcare Diagnostics, and also as a Research Associate for Roche.

At Cal, in addition to shouldering full course loads in the classroom, she found time to stay in touch with her love of music by becoming a violinist for the University Orchestra, and a teacher for the Young Musicians Program. She also was a Research Assistant for the Department of Chemistry and a Health Intern at Kaiser Permanente.

Fremont Asian Lions Club Youth Exchange Program

Purpose

The Lions International Youth Exchange program is organized to grant young people the opportunity to live with families in a foreign country and to gain an understanding about the customs, history and culture of people different from their own. The friendships, memories and experiences are all gained in a five or six week period. The ultimate goal is to have each participant, upon returning home, apply the greater awareness and appreciation of others to fellow students, friends and family; to foster harmony and understanding toward good will in international relations. This Youth Exchange student can truly be called "A Passport to World Peace and Understanding."

FAQ

Do I have to be a Leo or from a Lions family to participate in the Youth Exchange program?

No. The program is open to anyone who wants to travel or host as long as they are sponsored by and vouched for by a Lions Club.

How old do I have to be to participate in the Lion Youth Exchange?

To go to Japan you must be 16 year old and not over 21 at date of departure, except for Europe/Australia where you must be 17 - 21.

What is the procedure for applying?

Go to the MD-4 Youth Exchange committee website at <u>www.ye.md4lions.org</u> and the application forms and frequently asked questions (FAQ's) are there.

How can I request a Lions Club to endorse/sponsor me?

Ask your local Lions Club to sponsor you. Sponsorship does not mean the club will pay your way. It means they vouch for your good character and ability to handle the program.

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Go Abroad. The Lions Youth Exchange Program was launched to provide today's youth, the leaders of tomorrow, an opportunity to learn about people and countries other than their own in an effort to promote world peace. Young people are given the opportunity of living with a family or families in a foreign country for **5 weeks** to experience first-hand a new culture, history and a different way of life. The ultimate goal is to have each participant, upon returning home, share

his or her experiences in promoting international understanding.

Be a Host. Lions-approved host families are an important component of the Lions International Youth Exchange Program. Host families share their home with a young person from another country and include the participant in the daily customs of their culture for **5** weeks. Understanding different customs helps participants learn to accept the ways of others. At the same time, host families learn about the customs of the participant.

REQUIREMENTS

Go Abroad, Participants must:

- Be between the ages of 16 and 21;
- Be sponsored by a Lions club;
- Be suitable to represent their community, Lions club, and country;
- Be willing to accept the customs of another culture.

Be a Host, Families must:

- Approved by the host Lions club
- Be in contact with youth of the approximate age of the participant.
- Be familiar with Lions clubs and the goals of the Lions International Youth Exchange Program.
- Be able to provide a bed and meals for the participant.
- Follow all local laws related to youth protection.
- Meet insurance requirements.

If your family income is less than \$45,000 annually, VITA volunteers can help you file your tax returns for free! You may be eligible for the Earned Income Tax Credit (EITC) and/or other credits you did not know about.

The Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) program, sponsored by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS), is available for qualifying families and individuals at the Fremont Family Resource Center.
