#### Life Elder Care – **Meals on Wheels** Tri-Cities Homeless Coalition – **Project Independence**


I hope that you will participate in this year's event. What better way to thank your staff, friends and family than to go to an A's game with a great discount and help 2 very worthwhile community projects.

### Pathways to Positive Aging

Editor's Note: At the June CBC Board meeting, Ray Grimm, Ph.D., City of Fremont, presented the following information on "Pathways to Positive Aging." Pathways to Positive Aging, a project of the City of Fremont and the Tri-City Elder Coalition, is part of Community Partnerships for Older Adults, a national program of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation to help communities develop leadership, innovative solutions and options to meet needs of older adults over the long term. The program focuses on two groups:

- older adults who are at increased risk of disability due to poverty, race, ethnicity, chronic illness, or advanced age; and
- older adults with physical or cognitive impairments who require long-term care and supportive services.

Goals of this program include preparing informed consumers, decision-makers, and local leaders as well as identifying solutions that ensure older adults remain in their homes and communities as they age. The partnerships develop solutions—ranging from increased access to medical care to improved levels of social connectedness—that have a profound impact on older adults.

### The Challenge

Aging is a process we all share. Successful aging is in our own hands. What we can do for ourselves, however, depends in part on the opportunities and constraints that are presented to us as we age. The challenge therefore, is to create a system whereby older adults can understand, choose and access services and opportunities that improve the quality of their life.

The Tri-City Area of Fremont, Newark and Union City has a total population of more than 300,000. Since 1980, the population of the Tri-Cities has evolved from predominantly Caucasian to one where no ethnic group constitutes a majority. Because of this shift, there is a need to increase the efficiency and cultural sensitivity of all programs that serve our residents.

Our challenge is to build a community that is safe and welcoming, respects diversity and values senior participation. We aim to ensure that needed information is easily available to all seniors and that community members of different ages and cultural backgrounds interact and support each other.

#### The Project

The City of Fremont/Tri-City Elder Coalition Partnership focuses on five areas:

- 1) increasing older adults' access to services;
- increasing and sustaining older adults' mobility and dexterity;
- increasing the capacity of community groups to serve older adults;
- 4) fostering cross-cultural and intergenerational exchanges that include older adults;
- 5) and creating more meaningful opportunities (social, vocational, educational) for older adults.

As part of its cross-cultural efforts, the Partnership developed "Community Ambassador Programs" whereby volunteers with five different faith-based, ethnic or cultural organizations help older adults get needed information and referrals. On the health and mobility front, partnering agency LIFE ElderCare collaborated with Unitek College in Fremont to spearhead a 12-week in-home physical activity program for frail, homebound seniors. To date, 300 seniors are enrolled. The program is now a model that other Partnership organizations have begun to replicate.

#### <u>Successes</u>

The Partnership's Falls Prevention Program helped one local older woman significantly improve her quality of life. Two years ago, she was bed-bound because of a stroke. After participating in the in-home physical activity program, she now walks regularly through her neighborhood. Her physical health has improved and she once again feels connected to her community. The Partnership also collaborated with the Fremont Chamber of Commerce to produce an educational video on identifying seniors at-risk of losing their independence. This ElderSafe video trains employees of the U.S. Postal Service, local police and fire departments to identify at-risk seniors and refer them to the Seniors Help Line managed by the City of Fremont Human Services Department. In the first two months of 2007, there was a 27% increase in calls to the help line compared to the same time frame last year. This trend is expected to continue as all local buses will soon display the Senior Help Line phone number on their sides.

### CBC Members Henry Yin and Lena Zee Spearhead International Rotary Project SPAN (Stop Pediatric AIDS Now)

Recently on April 25, 2007, the Rotary International Foundation officially approved Project SPAN as a project for matching funds. Project SPAN is the only international matching grant application from the 7 Rotary Clubs in Area 3 that is approved by the Rotary Foundation this year. Project SPAN will be a 3-year project and it will provide over \$100,000 to battle the killer AIDS in China.

Both Henry and Lena are CBC Board Members, but as many of you know, they are also very busy with many other projects in the community. How they both became involved in this project goes back to 2006-2007 when Henry became the President-Elect of the Rotary Club of Fremont. Lena was serving as the Chair of International Services, an area of strong interest to Lena. Even before this problem had been identified, Lena was busily organizing a committee and starting monthly meetings involving all the presidents in Area 3. There were 7 clubs in all: Fremont, Fremont-Niles. Mission San Jose. Mission-Sunrise. Warm Springs, F.U.N. – Fremont/Union City/Newark. and Newark. The purpose of the committee was to first identify an interest and to jointly explore a worthy project that would meet the requirements of the Rotary International Foundation for an international project.

When Henry became President in July 2006, he told Lena of a documentary he had seen on a Chinese TV Channel about the plight of Yunnan, located in Hebei, China. Yunnan was battling an AIDS epidemic. Approximately 33% of babies born in Yunnan are HIVpositive when born. Even more tragic, most of these infected babies' mothers will also die of AIDS when their babies are only toddlers. At the same time, Henry and Lena learned of a former UCLA microbiologist Dr. David D. Ho, who had launched a project in 2005 targeting the acute rates of mother-tochild-transmissions (MTCT) in China. Dr. Ho and his staff had developed an anti-retroviral (ARV) medication that promised to reduce the 33% MTCT rate down to less than 2%. With Dr. Ho's treatment for a pregnant woman before and after delivery, her newborn's chances of getting the HIV+ disease could be reduced down to nearly zero. Over the coming months that involved fundraisers, meeting contacts and more experts, speeches and more meetings, the

beginning of an international Rotary effort to fund MTCT intervention and education in Yunnan took hold. The project was given the name Project SPAN (Stop Pediatric AIDS Now). The 7 Rotary Clubs in Area 3 collaborated with the Rotary Club of Shanghai under the leadership of founding Rotarian Frank Yih. Other Rotary clubs outside of Area 3 also joined in Project SPAN. These included Vacaville Rotary, Los Altos Rotary and Northbrook, Illinois Rotary just outside of Chicago. Together the Rotary Clubs pledged a total of \$13,807 for the first year and the Rotary Foundation initially matched this amount for a total of \$34,500. These funds are needed for buying rapid tests, inoculations, computer and accessories to facilitate work and education. And now, the project has been approved as an international Rotary 3-year project!

Project SPAN is out to save the world One Baby At a Time and it has just begun. Lena emphasizes that the Rotary Club of Fremont has only planted a seed. Lena says 'About 60 years ago, Rotary led the way in funding for polio vaccines all over the world' and she hopes that 'Project SPAN will have the same impact on AIDS.'
