Fremont, CA – Garrett Yee was honored with the *2010 Asian*

American Heritage Award for Outstanding Community Service. The award was presented by the Asian American Federation of California (AAFC) during its 17th Annual Asian American Heritage festival celebration on May 15, 2010. The Festival was held at the Southern Alameda County Buddhist Church in Union City.

"I am honored to receive this prestigious award and participate in this event celebrating the rich cultural diversity of our community," said Yee. "Being of Chinese and Japanese decent, I am proud of my heritage and our contributions to society."

The Festival had a number of demonstrations of traditional song, music, and dance from Japan, Polynesia, Taiwan, the Philippines, Hawaii, Thailand, India, the Middle East, China, and India. "Community service has always been a part of my life," Yee commented. "I value public service. We choose to serve our communities, our families, in different ways and I respect the need for true public servants. This is a value that comes from my parents — I grew up with great role models."

Garrett Yee, who currently serves as an Ohlone Community College District Trustee, is also proud to serve our country as a Colonel in the United States Army Reserve and is an Iraq veteran. 



South Bay Chinese Service Club's Annual Scholarship Luncheon

The South Bay Chinese Service Club awarded \$10,250 in scholarships to graduating high school seniors of Chinese descent at our 41th annual SBCSC Scholarship Luncheon held at the Courtyard by Marriott, Newark-Silicon Valley on Saturday, April 17, 2009. SBCSC President Amy Cho greeted the graduates and praised them for their outstanding academic records and participation in community activities. Honored guests included, Fremont School Board Members Lily Mei, former School Board Members Lily Mei, former Fremont City Councilman Steve Cho and his wife, Amy, Citizens for Better Community President Tim Tran and Board Members Josephine Chou, David Sheen, Thomas Tang, Gordon Jang and Stella Chang.

Stephanie Chuang anchor for KSBW Action News 8 Weekend Sunrise and a reporter for KSBW Action News 8 delivered the key note address. Stephanie is a Fremont native and graduate of Mission San Jose High School. She relayed how she first became interested in Journalism -speaking with a family friend who was a CNN correspondent and discovering the Medill School of Journalism at Northwestern from her high school Newspaper Advisor at Mission. Taking a "non-traditional" route, Stephanie spoke about the importance of following one's passions. Another key message that Stephanie shared with the students was get out of your comfort zone. Having worked and interned in cities such as Chicago and Topeka, Kansas, Stephanie stressed the importance of "getting out of the bubble" to understand different perspectives of the world.



Stephanie's speech was both entertaining and very insightful. She served as a great inspiration to our award winners.

The 29 applicants represented 7 different high schools in the Tri-City area. They are an impressive group of scholars. Their average GPA is 3.778 and together they have donated over 9,632 community service hours. In this group there are 6 National Merit Finalists and 11 AP Scholars. The students are also officers and members of a number of school clubs and in student government.

We often hear Fremont citizens saying how much they look forward to seeing the Chinese Americans turn out. This year, Citizens for Better Community, South Bay Chinese Club, American Chinese School, and Friends of Children With Special Needs are already planning to join the parade. There will be several more as the day approaches. Tri City Band Corps will be leading in front of us.

Some people are not interested in parades. Some are crazy about them. As one who used to be more or less uninterested, I can personally tell you that once you are in the parade, you become 'electrified'.

To give you some background about the Fremont July 4th parades... this will be the twelfth year of our city's parade. It has become a custom for the parade to rotate to different districts in Fremont (Warm Springs, Centerville, Mission, Niles, Irvington, and North Fremont). This year the parade will be a one mile long route and will be held in Mission San Jose. There are usually some 80 entries, including bands, drill and

dance teams, floats, clowns, antique cars to name a few. Thousands of people will watch the star spangled excitement of creative floats, specialty units, and marching musical units. Although the parade takes place on *Sunday*, *July 4*, at 10 a.m. and ends by 12 noon, those who participate in the parade usually need to assemble by around 8:30 a.m. The theme this year is "Stars and Stripes Forever!"

Please wear your purple T-shirt if you are a CBC member and have one. Otherwise, it will be great if you can wear red, white and blue. Members of other organizations joining CBC will wear their club T-shirts or uniforms too. CBC will provide flags for waving to all participants. Goal Setting Leads You to Success

Note: This speech was presented at a Toastmasters meeting.

Do you believe that goal setting can lead you to success?

Every New Year we get so excited about setting our new goals, but in reality, very few of us end up accomplishing them. Why is that?

There are several factors that can prevent us from accomplishing our goals. One can be that we are not serious enough about our goals. Another can be that all of our ideas were just spontaneous New Year's talk. Another factor can be a lack of motivation. Or perhaps the problem is that we do not know how to properly set goals. If this is the case, I want to offer some advice for goal setting.

When setting goals, keep in mind that your goals should be:

- Specific
- Measurable
- Attainable
- Realistic
- Timely

Remember, every goal starts as a dream. Many people talk about their dreams, but few of us see them through to reality. If you visualize your goal, it is possible. However, if you schedule it, it is real.

So how should you set your goals?

First, be aware of what you really want. What needs are you trying to satisfy? For example, perhaps you want to be a better person, or control your temper, or receive more recognition at work, or be recognized as a very successful person. Whatever you want, you can do it.

Once you decide on a goal, start measuring it. Think of how long it will take you to accomplish your goal. If it is a long-term goal, that is fine, but you may want to break it into smaller goals (ex: weekly, monthly and yearly goals).

Make sure your goal is attainable. For example, let's say your goal is to increase your salary by increasing

your sales. Yes, that is possible. However, if you say, "I want to make a million dollars buying the lotto," guess what? The probability of you winning that money is very low. You have to be more realistic. Otherwise, your goal will seem impossible to reach, and you will give up.

Be careful with whom you share your goals with. People will try to discourage you, and you may get disappointed and stop pursuing your goals. Share your goals with people who have similar values as you. Share them with people you admire.

Never give the excuse that you are too busy to work towards your goals. Make the commitment to yourself to complete your goals. Remember, you are the one who is going to be rewarded for your effort. Think of the satisfaction you will feel upon completing your goal. If you end up delaying some of the steps to your goal, that's fine. The important thing is that you eventually follow-through and get back on track because every action you take moves you closer to your goal.

I strongly encourage you to turn your dreams into reality. Avoid negative people that you might cross during the process. Remember, setting goals increases your self-esteem, self-respect, self-confidence, reputation, and prestige because you are becoming a new, better person. Use all the resources you have: Tapes, friends, books, feedback, etc.

In closing, I want to share with you these words my mother once told me, "If it is to be, it is up to you and nobody else!"
