
Chinese New Year Celebration "Year of the Rabbit"

CBC Toastmasters Wins Big at District 57 Fall Conference!!!

Justin Paras has been a member of CBC Toastmasters for almost 2 years when he took the stage at the District 57 Fall Conference on November 6. In front of approximately 200 Toastmasters from other clubs, Justin nailed the Evaluations Contest!

The road to the District 57 Fall Conference is a short one. But first, a background explanation of the conference. Each fall, District 57 holds a conference where the finalists for the Humorous Speech and Evaluations compete for the ultimate trophy. Out of the approximately 130 clubs in the District 57, each club must hold a contest in which the winning member of that club will go on to the next level. Each win allows the contestant to advance to a higher level until he/she reaches the District level. The winner of the Humorous Speech or Evaluations Contest at the District level is the final winner. Needless to say, placing first at the District 57 Fall Conference is the highest victory for a Toastmaster.

Our journey with Justin started with CBC Toastmasters back in August. We had never organized a fall contest at the club before, so it took some scrambling to prepare for it, but due to everyone's willingness to volunteer, we had a great turnout. Justin's win in the club meant he will represent us in the Area 29 Contest in September, the next level above. In that contest, members from two other clubs also competed. As Justin won the Area Contest, realization dawned upon us that he could have a shot to the top. That hope was fulfilled when Justin won the Division Contest in October. With each win, we, the members who watched Justin's climb, grew ever more confident about his chances. With each win, we felt pride and inspiration swell in our bosoms.

Of course, Justin worked hard too. What used to be good, constructive evaluations in club meetings now had to be meticulously crafted evaluations that were not only insightful and organized, but also had to be delivered in an articulate, polished manner. Justin would spend time watching sample speeches online and practice evaluating them in front of his family. His family members helped time his evaluation and offered feedback on points he may have missed, points that he covered exceptionally well. Justin spent more time perfecting his strategy for giving the best evaluation, studying other evaluators and the criteria on which the judges graded him. In the end, his dedication and commitment paid off.

On the day of the Fall Conference, Justin was nervous but also excited. All of us had a wonderful time seeing familiar faces from other clubs and sharing the feeling of camaraderie. The Evaluations Contest was held in the morning. The test speaker gave a hilarious, tongue-in-cheek speech on the joys of failure. As the rest of the audience laughed, the contestants were busy jotting down notes. After the test speaker sat down, the contestants came up one by one to give their evaluation of the test speech. They were all very good, but it was not until the closing ceremony at the end of the day when the judges announced the winners. Finally, the nerve racking moment ended when Justin was announced the winner of the Evaluations Contest. We leaped up in joy as he accepted his trophy. Photos were taken, congratulatory handshakes were exchanged. As the event wrapped to a close, we stepped out of the conference center into the cold November evening, but our hearts were warm with the pride and joy of success.

South Bay Chinese Service Club 2010-2011 Scholarship Program

The South Bay Chinese Club was formed in 1965 in order to preserve the culture and customs of the Chinese heritage, to foster and encourage better understanding of civic responsibilities and the American way of life, and to promote the general welfare of the community. In 1984 the Club formed the South Bay Chinese Service Club, a nonprofit, philanthropic organization.

The primary purpose of the South Bay Chinese Service Club is to award scholarships to graduating high school seniors of Chinese descent. Only students <u>residing in Fremont, Newark and Union</u> <u>City</u> or children of club members in good standing are eligible to apply. The actual number of scholarships will be determined by the amount of donations received. Last year two \$2,000, one \$1,500, two \$1,000, four \$500 and three \$250 scholarships were awarded.

In evaluating the applications the scholarship committee will consider *unweighted* grade point average, school activities, special achievements, community service activities, and a personal essay.

- 2) Name of High School currently attending
- 3) The email address to receive the application forms

The application deadline is <u>Saturday, March 12,</u> <u>2011</u>.

Scholarship winners will be invited as our guests to the South Bay Chinese Service Club scholarship luncheon on **April 9th 2011** where a guest speaker will address the graduating seniors, family guests, donors and club members.
