On a sad note, as the Taiwan nationals were preparing to celebrate Chinese New Year, a 6.4 magnitude earthquake hit the southern Region around Tainan. One high rise building completely collapsed. As a result, 116 precious lives were lost. About 300 survived, yet many may still be missing. Investigation is ongoing to determine if tin cans were used as fillers in the collapsed walls of the high-rise. The integrity of the builders had direct implications to the integrity of the building structure. Unfortunately, irresponsible compromise might have led to the deadly consequence that deeply affected the lives of those who depended on them. We send our condolences to the families of the victims.

The Founders of CBC commissioned our Board and members to initiate, sponsor and promote community events, which will affect the well being of Chinese Americans with an emphasis on education, health, business and community involvement. I may add, I am thankful to the vision of our Founders and I am honored to serve among our distinct Board members who understand virtue and integrity are key elements that have kept CBC's mission sound and thriving.

CBC/CBCF Celebrates 2016 Lunar New Year Gala Fundraiser for Fremont Unified's Mandarin Immersion Program

On Saturday, January 23, 2016, the Chinese Immersion Parents' Council of Fremont (CIPCF) sponsored the first-ever 2016 Lunar New Year Gala Fundraiser for the Fremont Unified School District's highly successful Mandarin Immersion Program at Azevada Elementary School.

The mission of the FUSD Mandarin Immersion Program "is to develop lifelong learners and well-rounded global citizens in an academically excellent, socially aware, and technologically advanced environment promoting Chinese language and cultural awareness." This program was launched 5 years ago in 2011 with one kindergarten class with the leadership of the Fremont Unified School Board, including former Fremont Unified School Board Trustee Ivy Wu and former School Board Trustee and now Fremont Vice Mayor Lily Mei, and the financial support of CBC/CBC Foundation (CBCF).



In celebration of CIPCF's 2016 Lunar New Year Gala, members of CBC/CBCF were joined by local dignitaries and parents who came together in a festive setting at Fremont's Asian Pearl Seafood Restaurant, enjoying a 9-course Chinese banquet. We were wonderfully entertained by Fremont-based Thunder Kung Fu Academy, with their breathtakingly stunning martial arts demonstrations, and their highly energized and choreographed lion dances.

The Gala attendees were welcomed by Fremont Mayor Bill Harrison who recounted his own son's experiences with his initial struggles and then accomplishments as a student in the Mandarin Immersion Program at Azevada.

The keynote speaker was the well-renowned Professor L. Ling-Chi Wang. Professor Wang has taught at UC Berkeley and chaired its Asian American Studies and Ethnic Studies departments. Professor Wang helped found immersion programs in the San Francisco public school district and planned the Fremont's Immersion Program and had a personal motivation in seeing it succeed – the program opened just in time for his granddaughter to enroll in kindergarten at Azevada. Professor Wang spoke movingly about overcoming resistance in the educational community to bilingual programs as studies conducted over the years confirm that mastery in Mandarin strengthens mastery of English.

This Gala also featured local TV media celebrity David Louie of ABC 7 who then broadcast the event on ABC 7 throughout the Bay Area.

From its one kindergarten class back in 2011, the Mandarin Immersion Program has now grown to 10 classes, with 2 classes in grades Kindergarten through 3rd grade, a fourth grade class and a fifth grade class, and an enrollment of more than 250 students. CBC/CBCF is proud to have partnered with CIPCF in the flowering of Fremont Unified's Mandarin Immersion Programs and looks forward to supporting this program's continued success and expansion to junior high in the near future.

CBC's Summer Toastmasters Youth Leadership Program

Toastmasters Youth Leadership Program (TYLP) is designed under the guidelines of Toastmasters curriculum to develop the public speaking and leadership skills of young adults to better prepare them to meet the demands and challenges of today's world.

TYLP is a five-week summer program that runs from June 18th to July 23rd (no class on July 2) and meets every Saturday morning from 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. at FCSN Center in Fremont. Parents are welcome to join in on the opening ceremony taking place the first day of class. At the last meeting on July 23rd, parents are encouraged to attend to hear student speeches. Students who complete the Toastmasters requirements will be awarded a certificate at the graduation ceremony (must attend at least 4 weeks of the program.).

Capacity is very limited. Early registration is strongly recommended. Register by *Sunday, April 24, 2016,* to be eligible for early registration and the discounted registration fee. SBCSC Scholarship Applications Now Available

Every year, CBC's sister club, the South Bay Chinese Service Club (SBCSC) awards scholarships to exemplary high school graduating seniors of Chinese decent. Only students residing in Fremont, Newark and Union City or children of club members in good standing with a minimum unweighted grade point average of 3.5 are eligible to apply. The actual number of scholarships will be determined by the amount of donations received. Last year, SBCSC awarded one \$2,000 scholarship, five \$1,000 scholarships, and eleven \$500 scholarships for a total of \$12,500 in awards.

In evaluating the applications, the scholarship committee will consider <u>both</u> weighted and unweighted grade point average, school activities, special achievements, community service activities, and a personal essay.

Walk of Remembrance ~ Celebrating Pacific Grove's Chinese Village and Pioneering Fishing Community

The 2016 Walk of Remembrance will begin with introductions at the Pacific Grove Museum of Natural History and include light refreshments. Introductions will be given by Pacific Grove Mayor Bill Kampe and Pacific Grove's Museum of Natural History Executive Director Jeanette Kihs. Gerry Low-Sabado, a 5th generation descendent of Pacific Grove's Chinese Fishing Village, will speak about her family's pioneering history. The Monterey Bay Lion Dance Team will lead the walk to Lover's Point, then along the bike trail, to the site where the village once stood. Comfortable walking shoes are recommended for the half-mile trek.

With the shared goal of honoring the lives of early Chinese-American settlers, the Walk of Remembrance is made possible by a partnership between The Pacific Grove Museum of Natural History, The City of Pacific Grove, The Heritage Society of Pacific Grove, The Monterey Bay Lion Dance Team, The National Coalition Building Institute – Monterey Chapter, and The American Civil Liberties Union – Monterey Chapter.
