Angela Yang was the Chief Librarian of the Fremont Main Library until she retired. She is often participating in CBC events and has contributed to the Chinese New Year celebrations.

Angela's son, Tsung-Tao Yang 楊宗道, passed away unexpectedly due to health reasons. He was kindhearted and considerate, a gifted musician, a natural athlete, a brilliant scholar, and a loving son. He was known by his initials T.T. T.T. was born in San Diego and received his Ph.D. in Economics from UC Berkeley. He was the Deputy Director in the East Asian Office of the U.S. Treasury Department in Washington, D.C. He made important contributions to our country and was a caring mentor to many of his younger colleagues. The Department held a memorial for T.T. and just named an annual Service Award in T.T.'s name.

In Angela's words, her son was "like a bright comet that lasted too briefly. It's against the law of nature to have parents outlive their child. I will miss him forever and try to accept God's will and remember how lucky I was to have the privilege of being his mother, even for such a brief time."

We in CBC all share in the loss of T.T. and send our sympathy to Angela and the entire family.

Some years ago the Cannery Row Company asked me for input regarding the interpretation of a life-sized bronze Chinese figure on a future Cannery Row Monument which would also include the figures of John Steinbeck, Ed Ricketts, Flora Woods, and the founders of the Cannery

I was delighted that a seat was reserved for me in the VIP area during the monument dedication on February 26, 2014. I was introduced to the audience along with a short narrative about the contribution of the early Chinese people and the tragic burning down of the Chinese Village on May 16, 1906.
