Superintendent of Fremont Schools Named CBC's Citizen of the Year

CBC's Citizen of the Year, Dr. Jim Morris, began his career in education thirty-four years ago as a teacher in the Los Angeles Unified School District and currently serves as the Superintendent of the Fremont Unified School District in Fremont, California.



Prior to being appointed Superintendent in Fremont in July 2010, he served as the Chief Operating Officer and Chief of Staff for 900 schools in the Los Angeles Unified School District (LAUSD).

During his thirty year tenure in LAUSD, he worked as a teacher, a principal, and a variety of other administrative positions including Assistant Superintendent of Instruction, and Superintendent of District 2 supervising over 100 schools with 103,000 students

and families in the San Fernando Valley. After serving thirty years in the LAUSD, he was selected as the Superintendent of the Fremont Unified School District where he is in his fifth year of service.

He holds a bachelor's degree from the State University of New York at Buffalo, a Master's degree in Educational Administration, and a Doctor of Education degree from the University of California Los Angeles (UCLA).

During Dr. Morris' acceptance speech at the Spring Celebration gala, he explained what it meant to be a Citizen of the Year and why is it such a humbling honor.

Real Estate Professional Named CBC's Volunteer of the Year

CBC's Volunteer of the Year, Lena Zee, immigrated from Hong Kong sponsored by the local Centerville Presbyterian Church and was blessed to be born to a Christian family where she learned about serving the community and helping the needy.



Lena received her B.A. at Baylor University and her M.A. at Stanford University and received her "American Education" by volunteering in classrooms from pre-school all the way up until her teenage daughters "discouraged" her because they needed "space" from their over-zealous volunteer mother.

Lena is a lifetime member of CBC for nearly 20 years and serves on the CBC Board, served as its Vice President and chairs the Culture Exchange Committee. She is actively involved in all aspects of CBC activities and CBC sponsored major events including Chinese New Year Celebration, Spring Celebration, Moon Festival, Voter Registration, July 4th Parade, to name a few.

Being head of household with two young daughters, Lena became a reputable real estate professional, crediting her success to being service-oriented.

Lena served as the first female president of Chinese ethnicity at the Rotary Club of Fremont in 2008-2009, tirelessly spearheading an international project called SPAN (Stop Pediatric AIDS Now), raising \$100,000 during the 3-year project and received the Distinguished Service Award as well as receiving

Commendation from the County of Santa Clara and a Proclamation from the County of Alameda.

She enjoys the performing arts, plays the piano and sings at the Centerian Choir, while being a lifetime member of local Broadway West Theatre. Lena translated an entire classical musical drama "Malan Flower" from Chinese to English for the Academy of Chinese Performing Arts in 2005. She serves on the Board of the Fremont Symphony Orchestra as well as being emcee at VIFE Benefit Concerts and supports numerous of other non-profit organizations.

"I feel tremendously honored to be standing here in front of so many of you, as the recipient of the CBC Volunteer of the Year Award. It is definitely a very humbling experience because of all the distinguished predecessors of this award in these past 23 years, and all the very qualified and equally deserving CBC volunteers who chose to honor me this year.
