# President's Message

The COVID-19 situation is much improved compared to the beginning of the year. Vaccines are now widely available and most everyone can easily register and get the shot. The local economy is also starting to reopen. Alameda County has been in the Moderate Risk level for 4 straight weeks and continues to see a decrease in the infection rate. Our neighboring counties Santa Clara and San Mateo just reached Minimal Risk level so achieving herd immunity is imminent.

Our hybrid online broadcast Spring Celebration was a resounding success. ## **CBC Supports "Unity Against Hate" Rally**

As you all know, Anti-Asian racism and violent attacks on Asians, many of them targeting the elderly, have only increased in recent months. Like many other organizations, CBC has made a statement and posted the following on the organization's website: "Citizens for Better Community condemns any racially targeted crimes against Asian and all ethnic communities. We promote unity to build a stronger community of diverse cultural background. We respect all members in our community. We denounce any discrimination based on race, color, religion, sex and national origin."

On May 15<sup>th</sup>, a national event "Unity Against Hate" took action against acts of hate on AAPI and all other communities. With CBC Board approval, CBC sponsored and participated in a rally held at the Veterans Memorial Park in Fremont.
