Words and Phrases (Prepared Speech)

Words, phrases and expressions have the ability to transform a mundane speech to an excellent speech. I have often taken the role of a grammarian during our toastmaster meetings and have listened for exceptional use of words and phrases.

I recently read the Nobel Prize winning book, "A Hundred Years of Solitude" by Gabriel Garcia Marquez. What stood out for me in this book was the beautiful phrases and prose. I started writing some of these phrases in a diary, some of them are the following:

The strength of our prejudices. Our solitude in disarray. A relationship that has ebbed and flowed. There is no illness that happiness cannot cure. Love's power to heal. Edit the past through the lens of our current times. The past brings tears, the future brings doubt, live for the present.

I realized that words and phrases say so much in such few words. Some phrases and quotes stand the test of time and have been around for centuries. The quote, "Character is destiny" is attributed to Herculitus about 500 BC. Julius Caesar's famous quote, "Veni, vidi, vici" - I came, I saw, I conquered is so well known even today.

Many phrases from Shakespeare's plays have become part of our everyday expressions— "These hands will never be clean" from Macbeth, "Unkindest cut" from Julius Caesar and from Hamlet the most quoted phrase, "To be or not to be that is the question."

Throughout history we have some very powerful phrases and quotes associated with historical leaders. One can easily remember JFK for the stirring line in his inauguration speech, "Ask not what your country can do for you — ask what you can do for your country." We remember Martin Luther King was his poignant message, "I have a dream". Phrases and expressions are still alive today from the speeches of historical figures like Winston Churchill, Mahatma Gandhi and many, many others.

The most recent movement, "Black Lives Matter"three simple words that speak volumes to the history of biases, police high-handedness, brutality and hardship of the African American experience.

South Bay Chinese Service Club Scholarship Awards Program

On Wednesday, April 27, 2022, the South Bay Chinese Service Club (SBCSC) awarded \$41,000 in scholarships to 22 exceptional high school seniors of Chinese descent at our Scholarship Awards Banquet at Grand Golden Bay Seafood in Union City, CA, after two years of virtual Zoom celebrations. This year is the 52nd anniversary of our scholarship program, and over the years, we have awarded over \$550,000 in scholarships to hundreds of Tri-City area high school students.

South Bay Chinese Club (SBCC) President Dr. Clifton Der Bing opened the banquet by welcoming and commending the graduates for their perseverance, and thanking the parents and scholarship donors for their interest and involvement. Scholarship Committee Chairperson Jane Lin praised the students for their outstanding academic achievements and exceptional community service, and encouraged them to "go out and conquer the world", then to come back and continue our important legacy. Past President and Scholarship Committee member Joe Woo then gave a brief history of the South Bay Chinese Club and the Scholarship Program.

Our Keynote Speaker Shelly Gin, the development manager at Chinese for Affirmative Action, a San Francisco-based non-profit founded to protect the civil and political rights of Chinese Americans, and to advance social justice and multiracial democracy in the U.S., gave an inspiring speech about "navigating and accepting" one's cultural identity and heritage, and finding the passion to fight for our beliefs.

In addition to receiving the monetary awards, the recipients also received a plaque and Certificates of Commendation and Special Recognition from U.S. Congressman Ro Khanna, State Senator Bob Wieckowski, State Assembly- members Alex Lee, 20th District and Bill Quirk, 25th District, Alameda County Supervisors David Haubert, First District, and Richard Valle, Second District, Alameda County Assessor Phong La, and Fremont City Mayor Lily Mei. These certificates, along with the scholarship award plaques and checks, were distributed by SBCC President Dr. Clifton Der Bing, Service Club President Aaron Wong, and Scholarship Committee Chair Jane Lin following a tasty 7-course meal.

The 22 scholarship winners this year are an impressive group of scholars representing 4 high schools in Fremont and one high school in Union City. The average unweighted GPA was 3.90, with an amazing 14,068 community service hours amassed. In this group, there were National Merit Finalists, numerous AP Scholars with Distinction and Honors, 7 students with a perfect unweighted 4.0 GPA, Eagle Scout and Girl Scout Gold Awards, Presidential Service Awards (Gold), Robotics Awards, Scholar Athlete Awards, student leaders in student government positions, a published author of math books for teens, a 3-time national Chinese calligraphy winner, and a US Table Tennis National Team member.
