President's Message

Dear CBC Members and Friends.

What are the most important skills in life?

That was the 'table topic' question that was posed to each of the student representatives from four CBC Toastmasters Youth Leadership program classes during the final speech competition this summer. 'Table topic' questions, in Toastmasters' lingo, are given to the speakers without preparation, and they are required to give impromptu speeches related to the topic.

Interestingly enough, all four classes' table topic contestants gave similar and very much related answers. They took turns to enter the room to hear the question for the first time, so they did not know about the answers of speakers before them. Class 1's Jack Liu said the most important life skill was the ability to give speeches and speak well. Class 2's Ethan Yuan said it was common sense and communication with others. Class 3's Tim Yang spoke of how to talk and interact with other people and form human relationships. Class 4's Felix Peng chose the ability to socialize and make friends.

The common theme among all four speakers' answers is verbal communication and relationship with others. I think the young students are very insightful and they are exactly right. They already know, correctly, at such young age, what the most important skills are in life. The ability to communicate with others effectively, building friendships and meaningful relationships,

and gaining acceptance and respect, have been the most important skills in life since human history, because human beings are social beings. No man is an island.



We know WHAT is important in life, but HOW do we gain these skills? How do we learn to communicate well and how do we form strong human relationships? Obviously, that's not easy and there can be many answers. Some seem to be natural born good communicators, but many of us need to work at it. I think there are two aspects to this - technique and content. CBC's Toastmasters public speaking class, as well as many other speaking and debate training programs can help you improve speaking techniques through practice and feedback loops. You learn to overcome your fear of public speaking by being prepared, doing it again and again, controlling your breaths, having the right postures and hand gestures, eye contact, interacting with your audience, so on and so forth. But the more challenging aspect is the content of your speech, what message do you want to deliver to your listeners, what will resonate with people and move people to want to connect with you and respect you.



What we can think of to say and do over time reflects who we are. And we all want to be around people who are positive, generous, helpful, open-minded, warmhearted, and honest. It's through being with people who possess these qualities that we either consciously or subconsciously become more like them. I must say in Citizens for Better Community and many other service organizations such as Rotary, both of these groups are full of such people. By working with people who are service minded and helpful in these organizations, you will develop a more positive outlook in life, and that will ultimately and naturally come through in the content of your speech. Messages and practice of love, compassion, inclusion, community service, combined with good speaking techniques will be good skills that people respond to, and make you a respected community member.

Speaking of respected community members, one only needs to look at the surprise going-away party that CBC hosted for Steve and Amy Cho on July 22nd at Fremont's World Gourmet Restaurant. Over 150 well-wishers from over 40 non-profit organizations that Steve and Amy belong to attended their surprise party. Many don't necessarily share the same political beliefs as Steve and Amy, but all who attended would agree that Steve and Amy possess the utmost integrity and community service orientation that we all look up to. And if it's still too abstract of a concept to grasp what the most important skills in life are, just ask Steve and Amy how they gain their respect and love from the Fremont community, and be more like these two exemplary CBC board members.

I was invited by Charles Fang Chen and his Jingxi Project-Based Learning Experience students from China to meet them at Stanford University to tell them about my family's Chinese American History on the Monterey Peninsula. Their plans included visits to Stanford's Hopkins Marine Station and the Monterey Bay Aquarium, both sites where my early Chinese ancestors' fishing village once stood.



I also was invited to go whale watching with the students on the Sea Goddess Whale Watching Cruise in Moss Landing. Carolyn Sotka, Adjunct Faculty, College of Charleston Graduate Programs, helped to host the students.

To my total surprise, the students' presentations of their projects about what they learned about the revival of the Monterey Bay and how they planned to bring what they have learned back to China to help the revival of the ocean around China took place at the Wave Street Studios. The studio is the site of my Grandfather's house where my Great Grandmother Quock Mui lived, where my Mother was raised, and where my sisters and cousins' families gathered for special occasions!! The students had interviewed me and will also report on the revival of the Chinese American history on the Monterey Peninsula!



On August 7, the Bunkmates and visiting Fremont Police Department officers came to the Chinese Bunkhouse during National Night Out Ice Cream Social at Shinn Historical Park hosted by the Chinese Bunkhouse Preservation Project and the Mission Peak Heritage Foundation!

"The Chinese Bunkhouse sits in the back of the Shinn Historical Park & Arboretum in Fremont, California. The bunkhouse was once part of a complex of buildings along Alameda Creek - for sleeping, eating, and washing - for the Chinese workers at the Shinn ranch. Only the bunkhouse and an outhouse remain now. A group has formed to stabilize the bunkhouse

so it may be used to tell the story of the people who helped build our town, when it was part of the Washington Township...from the Gold Rush, Transcontinental Railroad, Chinese Exclusion Act, World Wars, and finally the towns of Fremont, Union Citv. and Newark."
