Summer Toastmaster's Youth Leadership Program (TYLP)

It was my honor to serve as head coordinator for this summer's TYLP program. I assumed responsibility from last year's coordinator, Linda Ko, who orchestrated the program over zoom. A technological feat to be sure, but with lifted restrictions, this year we decided to "zoom away" from face time to meet in person, while reducing the risk of infection by meeting outside at Lake Elizabeth.



Our objective was to hold true to TYLP traditions, while experimenting with some new additions to the program. Here are some highlight updates:

- introduction of the classic book "How to Win Friends and Influence people" by Dale Carnegie, distributed to each student at orientation;
- 2) an "open air" format with team meetings conducted at picnic tables;
- a series of interactive lectures delivered by four experienced Toastmaster coaches, covering topics from voice and breath control, humor, and strategies for effective speech writing;
- 4) a final team presentation, based upon the principles of the Carnegie book.

From my perspective, the highlight of the 5-week program happened during week 4, when the 4 teams began working together brainstorming their projects. Their creativity and spirit of cooperation was on full display and they were clearly having fun.



Finally, I would like to thank coaches Justin Paras and Derrick Ho for assisting me with the program this year. A genuine thanks to Midji Rovetta and all the members of the CBC board, who embraced and approved the many program changes, with bravery and enthusiasm, without knowing how it would all turn out. Hopefully, we can carry forward with what worked best to next year's TYLP. Internship Program for Youths

CBC's Internship Program continued its tradition of focusing on placing interns at elected offices that have home districts in Fremont. This year, we are grateful to be able to send interns to the following elected officials: Congressman Ro Khanna, Fremont Mayor Lily Mei, and Alameda County Supervisor David Haubert.

Applicant interviews for CBC internships were conducted via Zoom like last year. It was a group interview format with all candidates answering the same questions in the same room, to simulate the panel interviews that the political candidates would face during the campaigns. Charles Liu and Herbert Chiu conducted the interviews and jointly made recommendations to the respective offices.



Congressman Ro Khanna's internship program is only open to college students, not to high school students like the rest of CBC's internship opportunities. This is because they require that the interns do some real case work and maturity is very important. Also, Congressman Khanna's interns actually become employees (part-time) of the federal government and get paid. This year, Rachael Chan had the opportunity and she won kudos from Congressman Khanna's office. The office was so pleased with the quality of CBC's intern, they are willing to take another CBC intern this year. The intern will need to work in Congressman Khanna's local field office, although due to the pandemic, many projects are done online in their own home. A suitable college-age student to be sent to the Congressman's office is not easy to find because the intern would need to be going to college locally; however, for this year's fall semester's internship program, Irvington High School graduate Caroline Xin who will be attending American University and is recommended by CBC, just got accepted to intern at Congressman Khanna's DC office. We wish her all the best! Any CBC members who know of strong candidates for future openings are encouraged to apply.

Fremont Mayor Lily Mei has consistently been the most reliable source of internship opportunities made available to CBC due to her strong support to our program, and they are highly sought after. We typically would interview and screen the most mature and outstanding candidates and send them to Mayor Mei's office for further interview and acceptance. Since the Mayor does not have dedicated staff working for her in the City, she needs to work with the other city staffers to help with the internship programs. Interns have been able to participate in some of the meetings that the Mayor attended and also prepare to get the residents input on key issues that they are concerned about. Originally, we sent two interns to Mayor Mei's office to be interviewed for confirmation, but this year due to increasing needs, we ended up sending two more interns, subsequently.

Lastly, Alameda County Supervisor David Haubert's internship program has been quickly developing and maturing due to resources that he has on his office staff. CBC sent two candidates to his office for the

confirmation interviews and both were accepted. They have been working on various projects such as attending meetings held by Alameda Public Protection Committee, the County Supervisor's annual BBQ event, etc.
