Joe passed away at the age of 72. He is survived by his beloved wife, Audrey, his four children: Matt (& Annabelle), Cameron, Serena (& Lee), Melinda (& Jian) and his four grandchildren: Samantha, Sydney, Sebastian and Skyler. Joe was born and raised in Yokohama, Japan attended St. Joseph High School in Yokohama and then St. Mary's University in San Antonio, Texas. After receiving his MBA, he moved to San Francisco to work for Bank of America for 27 years. Most recently, he was the President of Pan Pacific Bank of Fremont. During these years, Joe cultivated long-term business and professional relationships that held a significant impact in the community and on all that knew him.

Joe was incredibly generous and devout family man. He would help anyone that asked him, and always made sure that he and his family did the right thing. Though at times soft-spoken, his actions always had a great affect. Aside from his family, Joe loved tennis, family meals, gardening, the holidays, and his Oakland A's. Joe is deeply missed.

Reflections from Henry Yin....

I was first engaged into political campaign in 1988 running for the first Chinese American Board of Trustee with Fremont Unified School District, With absolutely no grass roots, campaign experience or community resources. I was supported by over 12,000 votes but still behind all 3 incumbents among 12 candidates. Mr. Joseph Ching, a well-known local business community leader, then invited me to a Friday morning coffee-donut gathering at a local bank where he served as Branch Manager. A hand-full of people of his organized group started a year-long brainstorming exercise on a commonly concerned issue - What should the Chinese American community in the Tri-City area do to establish grassroot connections and earn our deserved social status?

In 1992, CBC was then officially founded at my house to become what we are today 20+ years later.

For this, I urge everyone to remember Mr. Joseph Ching as one of the original co-founders of CBC.

Through Anna Wang, I had the pleasure of meeting Nancy Eddy, co-founder of Deaf Plus Adult Community. Anna shared this story:

"Nancy is a mother of 3 adult children - 2 with special needs. Her youngest child, Christy, has developmental disability and is also deaf. Raising a child with developmental disabilities (DD) is extremely difficult; but add to that, another challenge such as deafness, the task is incredibly daunting. Nancy's passion is with the disability community out of her kind nature but also influenced by her deep love of her children. She has worked as Associate Executive Director of Parents Helping Parents (PHP) and as Supported Living and

Independent Living Director for Friends of Children with Special Needs (FCSN). Nancy works with professionalism but everyone can feel the warmth of her caring heart. She is loved by all the consumers. Early in 2012, she pursued her dream and founded her own non-profit organization, Deaf Plus, to serve the deaf and developmentally disabled. Through faith and determination, her program is well on its way. However, city use permit compliance criteria are causing a shortage of funding to finish the improvements needed for the Deaf Plus Center. Please generously support Deaf Plus at the wonderful VIFE Christmas concert to serve the deaf DD community, an extremely underserved population."

Likewise, I share Anna's compassion and appreciate the urgent need for DPAC to raise funds so it may adequately serve the deaf DD community. On behalf of DPAC and VIFE, I sincerely invite you to join us at the benefit concert. Admission is free; all donations received at the concert will entirely go to DPAC's operation. Home from Afghanistan "Out of Harms Way"

We are at the end of our mission for my team in Afghanistan and it's time for us to go home. A year is a long time and to keep up the pace that we do is difficult to sustain for much longer than a year. At the end of September, our team held an informal Hail and Farewell where we hailed in the new team and said farewell to the outgoing team.

In saying good bye, I received much of the focus as their leader. While I have said good bye many times, this was by far the most significant good bye.

Members of Task Force 236 Afghanistan presented me with a very nice humidor to hold cigars and our most junior individual, Sr Airman Lose, presented a red painted wood star to represent the Senate confirming my promotion Brigadier General.

October 1st was my last day in Afghanistan. Colonel John Hamlette is now in the lead and it means that I can let go.

On the morning of Friday October 12, 2012, I got up at 4 a.m., turned in my linens to supply, and rode to the Columbus airport just outside Fort Benning where I caught a 6 a.m. flight to Atlanta.

I arrived at the Oakland Airport later that day where my daughter, Alissa, met me at the gate and ran into my arms. It was a moment... Maria was trailing behind Alissa and missed me walking off the plane by 30 seconds. As the three of us walked down through security, the rest of my family and friends were there waiting for me. It was quite the scene—we had the Patriot Guards, some Blue Star Moms, and we had two Gold Star Moms and one Gold Star Dad there, all my good friends.

Although in some ways the last 12 months went by fast, in other ways, it didn't. I've believed that it is often more difficult on the families of deployed service members than on those deployed. In my case, I know it was more difficult on my family than on me. I am very thankful for my family-my wife Maria, my children Gilbert, Michael, Alissa, and my parents, Gilbert and Michi. I am grateful for my extended family on both Maria's side and my side. We can't do what we do in the military without the support of our families and friends. It's great to be home!
