President's Message

Dear CBC Members and Friends.

Greetings! My name is Charles Liu, and it's really a great honor and privilege for me to serve as the next CBC President. I am absolutely humbled by the outpouring of support from fellow board members, who are all long-time community service volunteers. I have admired CBC for a long time, in fact, when we formed UBC (United for a Better Community) where I served as the first president three years ago, even the name was modeled after CBC.

CBC's 25 years of community service history speaks volumes. The founding members set up great by-laws and what's even more important, the board members really respect the by-laws and make them mean something. CBC has achieved great results, making Chinese American involvement within the mainstream society much more commonplace, culminating in successful elections of many city and state level officials such as Mayor Lily Mei, Raj Salwan, David Bonaccorsi, Steve Cho, Ivy Wu, Anna Muh, Yang Shao, Ro Khanna, etc.

The Chinese American community in the Bay Area, especially in Fremont, has changed and evolved a great deal in the past 20 years. Immigrants from

Many of them are past the stage of worrying about putting food on the table in their new adopted country, and many are eager to be more involved within the community. Many seem to be willing to form new groups and thanks to great new tools such as WeChat, they organize very well and effectively. We need to reach out to this group more and get their participation. There are great talents and enthusiasm within this group.

CBC's core programs that benefit the community such as Youth Toastmasters and Internship have seen declining participation, not due to the quality and nature of the program, but perhaps due to much more outside competition. These programs must continue and must be revitalized and expanded. They are great for our next generation to be more civically engaged. We must leverage our contacts and resources and send more interns to Congress, not just to our CA state offices. We should also expand our Internship program beyond political office internships and to other industries. In addition, we should create more business networking opportunities so that entrepreneurs and members alike can benefit from them and find CBC membership more rewarding.

We can set up new committees to include CBC members who are not on the Board, but who are nonetheless willing to help on specific topics. Although we can't be all things to all people due to limited resources, the key thing for us is to get more existing members to participate or get the newcomers to join CBC. And speaking of getting our CBC members energized, I also challenge our current CBC Board members to get more involved and do the best you can to bring new ideas and energy to help make CBC even stronger. In the coming weeks, I will be reaching out to each Board member to discuss ways to improve our Internship program and to create new programs that make CBC attractive for new members.

The great traditions of CBC will continue, and there are reasons why CBC has survived 25 years serving and promoting the well-being of the Chinese American community. Let's all unite around the idea of SERVICE, and help not just our Chinese American community, but build better relationships with the other communities. Let's work together to bring CBC to new heights. I am confident that the best days of CBC are yet to come. And I look forward to working with all of you, and your continued support to keep CBC strong and relevant for another twenty-five years and beyond!

Every year, CBC's sister club, the South Bay Chinese Service Club Scholarships (SBCSC) awards scholarships to exemplary high school students of Chinese descent in our local community. Children of club members and students residing in Fremont, Newark, and Union City are eligible to apply. Children of club members living outside of the Tri-City area are also eligible to apply if their parents have been members of the club, in good standing, as of fiscal year 2016-2017. The purpose of the scholarship program is to recognize these talented students for their hard work and achievements, and to provide encouragement for the challenges ahead. The applicants are carefully evaluated based on academic achievement, leadership, community service, and extracurricular achievement.
