We experienced the biggest explosion of applications for our summer public speaking program -Toastmasters Youth Leadership Program (TYLP). Through WeChat advertising, we immediately reached our maximum enrollment of 60 students and the wait list of a potential second session also filled up quickly.



The summer internship program which places students in legislative offices similarly saw an increase in the number of applicants. The Chinese American community in Fremont, as well as immigrant parents know the importance of public speaking and communication skills, and not only do they enroll their kids in public speaking programs, many of the parents also signed up with the adult CBC Toastmasters program! This year, CBC was happy to 'discover' and newly connect with OMC (One Myanmar Community), a major non-profit organization in the Bay Area with Myanmar Americans and immigrants. Their Board of Directors have come to CBC Board meetings as guest speakers and we have supported and participated in each other's events.

With participation from the Myanmar, Muslim, Indian,

African and Caucasian communities, we all got together at Fremont's Central Park to hold a premiere One Community, One World concert to promote inclusion and community harmony.



CBC has long been an active participant in Fremont's 4th of July parade. This year, through the hard work of two very capable and creative CBC interns, lwy Zhang and Rachel Lin, they implemented Board member Steve Cho's idea to make CBC's 4th of July Choo Choo Train which won the parade's People's Choice Award!



Steve Cho's Uncle Sam rendition in Fremont's 4th of July parade has become an event classic, and that is just one of the many reasons why Steve and Amy Cho will be so missed by the Fremont community. They have moved to Roseville to be closer to their family. ### Homeless Shelter Meal Service

By 4 p.m. on September 29, 2018, most of the student and adult volunteers have already signed in at the front desk, ready to roll up their sleeves and start making meals for the residents at Sunrise Village Abode Services. "Is tomato sauce used today?" asked a frontdesk staff. After hearing our answer, she turned to a resident, "It's your lucky day, no tomato sauce." In fact, it's a lucky day for many residents, as they only get to indulge in CBC's signature dishes 4 times per year roasted chicken drumsticks and steamed cabbage with honey bacon.



After a few basic instructions, various spots of the kitchen were occupied with helpers busy with their assignments. A front-desk staff walked in with 14 empty meal boxes. These were for some staff and residents who would be eating their dinner after the regular serving time (5:45 p.m. - 6:15 p.m.). By 5 p.m., it was time to pick up the fried rice from Marina Food donated by a CBC member. At 5:42 p.m., the serving windows opened up to a few residents eagerly waiting in the dining hall. "Two adult plates and one child plate'; "Can I have a plate with no cabbage?"; "Siracha please."; "The waffle cookies are tasty, can I have more?" - the students took orders and juggled. More lemonade and orange juice were made as they ran out. The last plate was served around 6:20 p.m. as there were a few late comers. The sun was setting when we signed out of the kitchen rejoiced with knowing that the residents enjoyed the meals!

## Message from Summer Intern


Sorry I cannot make it to the Intern Recognition today (November 18, 2018).

We visited the site where the McAbee Beach Chinese Village once stood and posed with the wonderful Monterey Bay Chinese Fishing Village Descendants Banner that Elaine Lee/Print 'N Graphics created for me. C.A.C.A., Salinas Lodge President Herb Wong's Mother and my Mother were born in this village in the early 1900's. Our Mothers were sisters and granddaughters of Quock Mui.



Munson Kwok and I, both descendants of the Pacific Grove Chinese Village, speak about the Chinese Junk (boat) on display at the Pacific Grove Museum of Natural History



https://www.pgmuseum.org/. Our ancestors sailed from Southern China to the Carmel Point Lobos area in the early 1850's. Visiting the Point Lobos Chinese Cabin. My Great Grandmother Quock Mui's photo is displayed in this cabin. Quock Mui was born in Point Lobos in 1859 and is the first documented Chinese female born in the Monterey Bay area.

The Program is entering into its 49th year of awarding scholarships to exemplary high school students of Chinese descent in our local community. Children of club members and students residing in Fremont, Newark, and Union City are eligible to apply. The purpose of the scholarship program is to recognize these talented students for their hard work and achievements, and to provide encouragement for the challenges ahead. The applicants are carefully evaluated based on academic achievement, leadership, community service, and extracurricular achievement.

The deadline to receive the application form is *Wednesday, February 21, 2019*. All supporting application materials (official transcript and letter of recommendation) must be received by Friday, February 23, 2109. Last year with record high generous donations from many of our members and sponsors such as Fremont Bank, Comcast, BlackRock, Republic Services, Dutra Enterprises, and Citizens for Better Community, we awarded a total of **\$27,000** in scholarship awards to 22 students. This year, with your help, our goal is to generate an equal or higher amount for our scholarship fund.



The scholarship awards will be presented during the annual scholarship banquet to be held on the evening of *Wednesday, April 10, 2019,* at the Mayflower Restaurant in Union City. Our guests will include applicants, donors, former award winners, club members, school counselors, and local officials. A special keynote speaker will address the graduates and the guests.
